

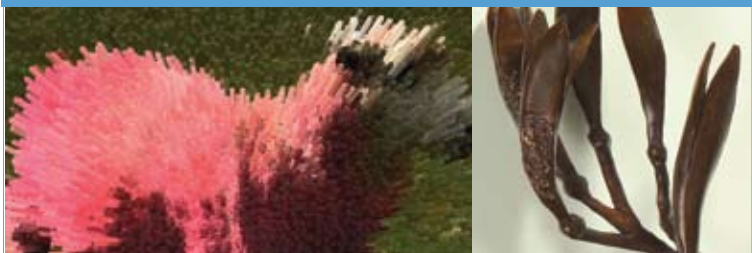


Art in the Woolshed

SUPPORTING TAWHARANUI OPEN SANCTUARY

The 5th Art in the Woolshed exhibition is an opportunity to view outstanding contemporary painting, sculpture, ceramics, glasswork and photography by leading and emerging New Zealand artists. The exhibition is held in the transformed woolshed at Tawharanui Regional Park, with larger sculptures displayed in the pohutakawa-studded area adjacent to the lagoon.

Art in the Woolshed 2010 is curated by Barry Lett and Mike Petre. Invited exhibitors include many returning artists and others who are participating for the first time. Three environmentally-themed installations are an additional feature of this exhibition.

Art works are for sale and may be paid for by cash, cheque, eftpos, Visa or Mastercard. All funds raised through Art in the Woolshed 2010 will support current projects within Tawharanui Open Sanctuary.

The exhibition is organised by Tawharanui Open Sanctuary Society volunteers with the valued assistance of the exhibiting artists, Auckland Regional Council, and Rodney District Council.

The exhibition art shop offers smaller works and art and craft items for sale. Good coffee and quality food are available throughout the exhibition.
